Because of your prayers, love, and generosity during 2025, thousands of innocent lives once marked by despair found hope, healing, and a future.

At our Casa Jackson Hospital for Malnourished Children, Evelina, a two-year-old who weighed less than a newborn, arrived in her mother's arms.

With gentle care, warm meals, God's grace, and our amazing Casa Jackson staff and volunteers, she began to smile again.

I was in Guatemala two weeks ago and watched Evelina run through our courtyard laughing - healthy, loved, and home again in her mother's embrace.

And from the mountainous Mayan highlands of Guatemala, Lucia, a young mother of three, walked five hours to get to us after escaping years of abuse. She was silent at first, clutching her baby as if the world she had just escaped could steal her back.

But through your support of our Women's Empowerment and Academic Scholarships programs, Lucía learned a new trade, received counseling, and moved into a safe home built by GCP ServiceTeam volunteers from Texas.

Today, Lucia leads other, newer mothers toward the same freedom she found through the Project.

These are only two of the countless miracles YOU and your GOD'S CHILD Project family made possible in 2025. Because of you, the hungry were fed, the sick were healed, and the forgotten rediscovered their worth as people with a future, and as children of God.

We're looking forward to 2026 with gratitude and faith. Together with you, we are answering Christ's call in Matthew 25:40: "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

EDUCATION

NATIONAL SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

Education is the only way impoverished children will break out of poverty, so to maximize our impact and involve both the child's immediate family and local community, Your GOD'S CHILD Project provides boys and girls with academic scholarships that pay for the children's enrollment fees, school supplies, monthly tuition, and required school clothing.

ACADEMIC REINFORCEMENT PROGRAMS

The GOD'S CHILD Project's Academic Reinforcement Program is based out of the Project's Dreamer Center and is open to everyone. Students regularly come for tutoring in math, science, language, and computer skills, as well as a hot meal, recreational activities, and safety.

HOUSING

SERVICETEAMS AND VOLUNTEERS

Between January and November of this year, we worked with over 27 international home building ServiceTeams in Guatemala. During this same time, our team members dedicated nearly 26,000 hours partnering with over 500 ServiceTeam volunteers to build brighter futures for children and families.

- » **7,800 ServiceTeam Hours Built 52 Homes**
- » **192 Family Members Impacted from a Home Build**

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

During the first 10 months of 2025, our dedicated outreach team - both staff and volunteers - has provided life-saving medicine, groceries, and clothing to individuals and families in need. Their compassion continues to bring hope and relief to some of the most vulnerable members of our community.

- » **Over 6,200 people were visited through family visits this year**
- » **Over 1,300 Family Members Benefiting from Clean Water with Ecofilters**
- » **Over 240 Children Now Have Beds (and no longer sleep on dirt floors)**
- » **136 Solar Lamps Distributed**





HEALTHCARE

NUTRITION AND RECOVERY PROGRAM: THE DAN AND KENDAL MCDONALD (BEAVERTON, OR) DINING ROOM

Guatemala continues to face one of the highest rates of chronic malnutrition in the world — the most severe in Latin America and the Caribbean. Nearly half of all children under the age of five suffer from stunted growth caused by prolonged malnutrition, a crisis that deeply impacts their physical health, cognitive development, and future potential.

» This Year, 43,150 Family Members Fed Through Weekly Vegetable Distribution

EMERGENCY RELIEF

Following the earthquake in Santa María de Jesús, our Emergency Relief team responded immediately to provide critical assistance. Families received food, clean water, clothing, and emotional support as they faced the loss and fear caused by the disaster.

- » 190 people received immediate assistance through our emergency relief
- » 100 individuals received psychological and emotional support to help them recover from the trauma of the earthquake.



CASA JACKSON HOSPITAL FOR MALNOURISHED CHILDREN

Since founding in 2008, Casa Jackson Hospital for Malnourished Children has grown to become Central America's foremost beacon of hope in the battle against malnutrition.

Staffed by 10 nurses, 1 nutritionist, and several volunteers, our Casa Jackson team works closely with the University of Texas, Austin, to develop and record statistical data processing in the areas of early stimulation, physical recovery, and rehabilitative progress.

- » 7,680 Meals Provided to Children and Mothers
- » Over 10,000 Bottles Given to Malnourished Babies

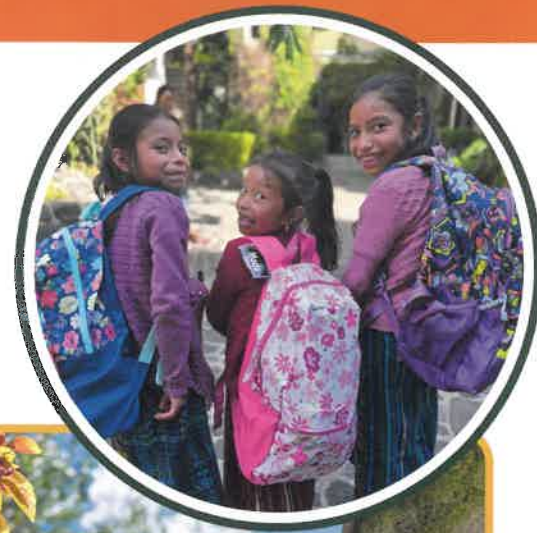
THE PROJECT'S FINANCES

Between July 1st, 2024 and June 30th, 2025 (Fiscal Year 25), your GOD'S CHILD Project saw an increase in revenue and a decrease in expenses, compared to the prior fiscal year of July 1st, 2023 and June 30th, 2024 (Fiscal Year 24).

This is certainly good news and the right direction in which we want to move. With these financial improvements, we were able to reduce the operating deficit of \$321,851 in FY24 down to \$108,679 this year, FY25.

We are placing major emphasis on filling out the stateside GOD'S CHILD Project fundraising staff, and now have a multi-state event coordinator for Minneapolis (MN) office. At the time of this writing, we are also recruiting regionally for a Director of Development to lead all of our fundraising and community development efforts.

Patrick Atkinson and Miguel Angel Alvarez Paz (Guatemala) recently completed Miguel Angel's full-length memoir of life on the streets of Antigua Guatemala from age 7 - 18, and have high hopes for this project. With this book done, Patrick has returned to writing his 6-part growth and leadership series, the first of which, "Beyond The Finish Line", is a practical guide to Servant Leadership (in a very crazy world).

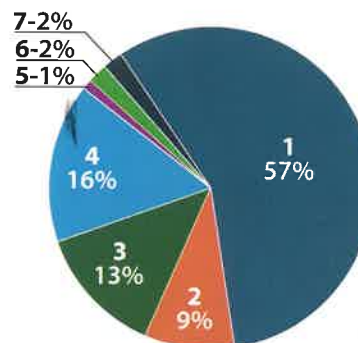


Our 2025 Fiscal Year (FY25) is
